Local Minimum Wages



Labor Market Information is critical to make hiring decisions. It is

important to keep up with what your staff could be making somewhere else. You need to know what a person with the skills and experience for which you are looking is paid in our region. Unfortunately, it may take some research on your part to determine the pay scale and benefits being offered around the region.:

- You may need to scan job sites to find like-jobs in the region.
- GlassDoor has some research on occupations and industry paid rates for the San Francisco.
- The California Economic Development Department has information on Occupational Employment Statistics and Wages (OES)
- The Bureau of Labor Statistics has national information on pay and benefits.

Minimum wage also varies by location. With the mobility of our region, it is important to realize that your potential employee does not need to drive very far to get a dollar or more an hour. Below is a graph with current and future state and local minimum wages for cities in the Bay Area. If your city is not list, its minimum wage is that of the state's.
